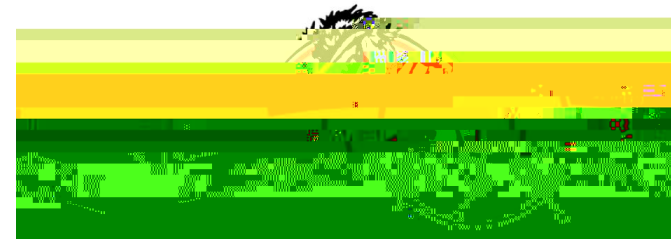

Overview

Recognition

CHS has partnered with NJ Positive Behavior Support in Schools (NJ PBSIS) to help us develop an intervention continuum to plan for preventing and, when necessary, intervening with social, behavior, and conduct issues.

Each school, through student and staff input, determines their pillars that they will strive towards. CHS pillars are:

Responsibility
Respect
Acceptance
Success

How does it work?

Through a 4:1 positive to negative correction ratio, students will be taught the school wide expectations. Expectation posters will be displayed throughout the school and reviewed frequently for reinforcement. Expectations and routines will be modeled frequently. These expectations will also be utilized to reinforce appropriate expected behaviors in any school setting.

It is not a curriculum - it is a framework for systems to identify needs, develop strategies, and evaluate practices for success.

PBSIS is a tiered system of support, which is driven by data.

PBIS Rewards

When students are found following school wide expectations and displaying positive behaviors, they can earn

MUSTANG POINTS!

Mustang Points will be handed out throughout the day and can be used to purchase rewards and prizes from our Mustang Marketplace on our PBIS Rewards website (www.PBISrewards.com). Students will also be able to purchase incentives from individual teacher stores. This is our way of recognizing and rewarding positive behavior.

Teachers will also be recognizing students for prosocial behaviors throughout the school year using

Shout Outs!

Students will receive an email from their teacher and their name will be featured on the morning news and CHS social media accounts.
